#### Semester 1 Midterms!

The middle of semester 1 (Term 1) is Thursday November 10<sup>th</sup>, all students need to ensure that their work is up to date so their grades (Term 1 report card) reflect their full learning.

Any parents with concerns please call the school immediately to arrange a teacher meeting if necessary. Course failures at the Grade 10-12 level may have an impact on graduation eligibility.

School Messenger - LCSS is using School Messenger automatic callout module. The program is linked to MyEd BC and sends out emails, phone calls and messages to parents whose children did not go to class for that morning or afternoon (unexcused absence). ### Grade 10 & 12 Literacy and Numeracy Assessments – First Session Oct. 31 – Nov. 4

All Grade 10 students are required to complete a Grade 10 Literacy and Numeracy Assessment and Grade 12 students must complete a Grade 12 Literacy Assessment to meet graduation requirements. There are 4 scheduled assessment dates: October 31 – November 4, January 23-27, April 24-27, and June 26-29.



All Grade 10 & 12 students are required to write these assessments as part of their graduation requirements. Students will be informed of their exam schedule at least a week in advance. Students can rewrite these assessments to improve their marks if they choose.
