Code of conduct

Safe and Caring School Culture Meeting



Grade 10 & 12 Literacy and Numeracy Assessments

All Grade 10 students are required to complete a Grade 10 Literacy and Numeracy Assessment and Grade 12 students must complete a Grade 12 Literacy Assessment to meet graduation requirements. There are 4 scheduled assessment sessions throughout the year: October 28 – November 5, January 13-24, April 7-11, and June 2-13. All Grade 10 & 12 students are required to write these assessments as part of their graduation requirements. Students will be informed of their exam schedule at least a week in advance. Students can rewrite these assessments to improve their marks if they choose.

Volunteering at the School – All volunteers volunteering their time to support school events must have a criminal record check completed before they start helping out.
